CASES DEMANDING FURTHER MEDICAL ATTENTION:

Sometimes it is impossible to turn a blind eye. Our annual mission trip to Marre Blanche, Haiti, July 19 to 27 was a tremendous success. More than 280 students received school physicals. Three individuals required follow-up help. What should have taken three to four days has turned into eight days and counting due to a rain storm that washed out mountain roads, vehicle break downs, return visits to the doctors and follow-up medical tests—all while the clock is ticking on vehicle rental. **Please pray for relief and that each person will receive the life-changing medical attention needed.**

DANIEL ANTOINE'S FOOT NEEDS MEDICAL ATTENTION

Our annual mission trip goal is to complete physicals with each student enrolled. However, because there is no medical help available in the mountains, we set aside the last day of our visit to see adults and other individuals not enrolled in our school.

Twenty-six year old Daniel was injured in May of 2013 while helping to build a house. Dr. McAleer, a podiatrist in Jefferson City, Missouri, has been successful in finding an American Medical Missionary Podiatrist and Surgeon to advise us on how to help him. **Please pray that God will touch the hearts of people to give so that his health and future are not further jeopardized.**

In 2017 our Haitian nurse made note that Ymanorld appeared to be malnourished. We did a follow-up visit with a nutrition clinic that determined that he did not meet the criteria for severely malnourished. Soon after, the clinic closed. This year he was visibly more emaciated than the previous year. His doctor's visit thus far has revealed that he does not have tuberculosis. He does have a skin issue and further examinations and recommendations are unfolding. We have learned that he is from a very poor family with five children. He will be getting additional food, garden seeds, and a water bucket filtration system for his home, His sponsors are Joe and Cynthia Berry of Conowingo, Maryland. This is the second year that representatives of Hope for Caribbean Kids, Inc. Board of Directors have attended the KC Haiti Symposium. Grace Bertrand, John Talley (wife, Sonja) Richard and Iva Presberry went on September 8. After attending last year, we joined Haiti One which qualified us to begin shipping items directly into Haiti through Convoy of Hope. Prior to our trip to Haiti we shipped ahead 30 boxes containing 365 pairs of shoes and other supplies. On the 24th of September we shipped 29 boxes containing 601 pairs of shoes. **THIS MARKS THE BEGINNING OF EMPLOYMENT OF HAITIANS SELLING SHOES FOR US WITH PROCEEDS GOING TO SUPPORT THE SCHOOL. This, of course, will require Pastor Wisny to travel 17 hours from his home in Mare Rouge to get them. Then 9 hours back to Port-au-Prince for passport photos and back home again. The passports will cost \$300 each and take about three months to process.
